The State Commission on Judicial Conduct ("SCJC") is comprised of thirteen members: six judicial members appointed by the Supreme Court of Texas, two attorney members appointed by the State Bar of Texas, and five public members (who are neither judges nor attorneys) appointed by the Office of the Governor. The mission of the SCJC is to protect the public, promote public confidence in the integrity, independence, and impartiality of the judiciary while encouraging judges to maintain high ethical standards of conduct on and off the bench. The primary method for achieving this mission is through the investigation of allegations of judicial misconduct or disability. In appropriate cases where there is sufficient evidence that a willful or persistent violation of the Texas Code of Judicial Conduct has occurred, the SCJC may take disciplinary action against a judge through (i) a private or public sanction and/or an order of additional education; (ii) a suspension order; (iii) acceptance of a voluntary resignation agreement; or (iv) formal public proceedings that could result in a judge's public sanction, censure, or a recommendation for removal from office. On September 1, 2023, a constitutional amendment took effect providing additional powers to the SCJC with respect to candidates for judicial office, pursuant to Section 1-a, Article V, Texas Constitution.

The SCJC has three funding priorities for FY 2026/2027 biennium.

1. Judiciary-Wide Inflation Relief (\$61,216 Annual/\$122,432 Biennium)

The SCJC expresses its appreciation to the Legislature for the positive impacts of the recent round of pay raises, both targeted and across the board. However, even after the increased funding received in the 88th Legislative Session, attorneys and staff of the Article IV Courts and Agencies, which includes the SCJC, remain impacted by the increasing costs due to inflation and the draw of higher paid employment opportunities in other governmental agencies and the private sector.

The SCJC is aware of the need to adequately compensate its highly skilled attorneys and staff to efficiently and effectively assist the agency in complying with the statutory mandates relating to the investigation and disposition of cases, and to fulfill the mission of the agency. Retaining existing staff and recruiting qualified candidates are of utmost importance, not only because of the experience and expertise required for the unique work in the area of judicial discipline, but also because the SCJC expects high ethical standards and confidentiality that accompany working for the agency. The SCJC, in concert with the other Article IV Courts and Agencies, is therefore seeking a 6% increase in staff salaries this biennium.

2. Funding to Increase General Counsel Salary (\$5,500 Annual/\$11,000 Biennium)

The salary of the General Counsel should be increased to reflect the responsibilities of the position and to remain in line with similar positions in other judicial conduct agencies in other states and the appellate courts. The nature of the work performed, and the expertise required of a SCJC General Counsel demands that management be able to hire and retain seasoned candidates with exceptional advanced legal experience. The General Counsel's duties includes, but is not limited to, the management of the agency's legal team; handling the more complex cases requiring a thorough and full investigations; providing legal advice and counsel to the SCJC members; handling proceedings relating to the appeals of SCJC sanctions; assisting special counsel at all stages of litigation and/or formal proceedings; handling hundreds of ethics calls each month from judges, attorneys, and others; and handling ethics presentations at judicial training programs across the state throughout the year.

3. Increase Funds for Commissioner Travel (\$3,900 Annual/\$7,800 Biennium)

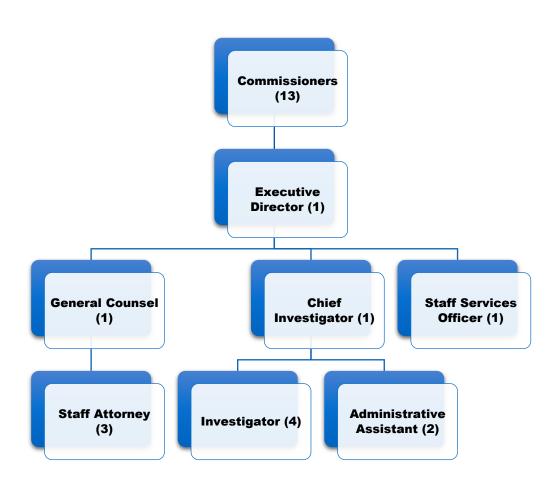
As travel costs, particularly lodging in downtown Austin continues to rise, the SCJC finds that it needs additional funding to accommodate the increase in the maximum lodging rates for Austin, Texas. In order to fulfill its mission and achieve the agency's annual performance measure, Commission members travel to Austin six times per year to attend meetings that last between two to three days each. The agency's current travel budget for Commissions was initially based on a maximum lodging rate of \$120 per day. The agency is seeking additional funding to cover the difference between the original \$120/day maximum lodging rate to the current \$170/day maximum lodging rate for its member to travel to Austin to attend six 3-day meetings per year of the biennium.

In order to meet its mandate and provide essential services to the state, the SCJC respectfully asks that its appropriations request receive favorable consideration.

The SCJC promotes public confidence in the integrity, independence, and impartiality of the judiciary while encouraging judges to maintain high ethical standards of conduct on and off the bench. The agency investigates allegations of judicial misconduct or disability, and takes appropriate action, including sanction, education, or the filing of formal proceedings that could result in the judge's censure or removal from office.

#### EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS IMPACTING STRATEGY:
